B. If project is operational, describe its overall progress to date by each task in the project. The second quarter resulted in 84.5 hours used by officers; 138 vehicle stops were made resulting in 242 persons contacted. 81 written warnings were issued, 46 speeding tickets were issued and 14 other traffic violations were issued. One OSC ticket was also issued. Six PBT's were given and one DUI arrest was made and one designated driver was encountered. Ticket revenue totaled \$ 8,221.00. Salaries for the period were \$ 4,193.44 and \$ 967.68 mileage totaled \$ 5,161.12, resulting in a positive revenue source of \$ 3,059.88.

For the period of 01/15 to 03/15 there were 25 officer hours that resulted in 31 vehicle stops and 49 persons were contacted. The second quarter of 2016 showed an increase of 238 % in officer hours expended; a 345 % increase in vehicles stopped and a 393% increase in persons contacted versus these same periods for 2015. The percentage increase is due to the increased deputy participation in the DUI Grant program and using real time data to target high traffic volume ques.
